BOARD OF MANAGEMENT REPORT

The Board of Management met for its February Meeting on Friday, 21st February.

With only two more meetings scheduled before the end of the Club's year, it considered a full agenda of ongoing issues, and issues that would need to be on the agenda for the new, incoming BOM in May. The Minutes of the Meeting have been distributed and are posted on the Club's website.

For the purpose of this report, a snapshot of the key issues are noted below:

Finance:

- The Club will report a further loss in the financial year. This is the fourth year in a row that a loss has occurred.
- Bowls revenue is down, bar revenue is down. Other income streams are down.
- Whilst the revenue is down compared to last year, generally, expenses have been contained during the period.

Notwithstanding, the auditor has noted in a partial audit of the accounts, that the Club needs to focus on increasing revenue as the Club's viability is in focus, given that there has been losses for the last four

years. The BOM agrees and the Club's strategies, going forward, is to arrest the trend in its strategic planning.

In this respect, the BOM will consider new revenue streams to support the ongoing viability of the Club. Several options are under consideration. The bottom line is that all of the club's assets that contribute to the revenue stream need to do better, and the BOM considers that they can do better. Similarly, all items of expenditure need to be carefully analysed and savings made where possible. This can be done and the Club's forward planning suggests that progress can be made and that the Club can look forward to a progressive next 70 years.

Every member has a part to play in contributing to the needs of the Club. Please consider this over the next couple of months and identify areas in which you may have expertise that would be of value, or simply to be part of the volunteer group that works diligently to improve the wellbeing of the Club. To simply turn up and enjoy the offerings of the Club, and contribute nothing, is not an option.

The BOM has canvassed a number of ideas for revenue raising, and expense savings, and will meet shortly for a "brainstorming session" to further explore these. Some of these ideas are noted in the Minutes, as is the current diary of Marketing, Special Projects and Clubhouse Functions. All suggestions in any of these areas are welcome.

Notwithstanding, the Club assets remain solid and the future looks bright.

House and Physical Environment:

Neil English prepared a written report for the BOM, and this report is recorded in the Minutes.

The only new item that has since occurred that will need attention is that three (3) flood lights have ceased to function, two (2) on the NE corner and one (1) on the SE corner. The Club's property contact at Manningham Council has been contacted, seeking Council support in replacing the blown globes, but the request has been rejected.

Neil is currently seeking electricians who may be able to replace the globes, and an estimate of costs. A "cherry picker" will be required.

Greens:

The report of the Greens Director is included in the Minutes.

Special Event:

The Club will partner with Manningham Council and Bowls Victoria to promote a Special Day at the Club on Sunday, 31st May.

The day will consist of a variety of special events under the umbrella of a Community Family Fun Day, and is being be promoted under the name of "Respect Sport and Games".

Manningham Councillor Dot Haynes and Tricia O'Connor are driving the day which promises to be one of the largest community days (if not the largest) ever held on the Club's grounds.

Marketing, advertising and promotions have already commenced and final touches are now being put to the program.

A number of volunteers will be required and further details, including the program of events, and marketing material, will be advised to members shortly.
